## Introduction to the Health Care Industry in BC<sup>1</sup>



Provincial hospital insurance has been available in BC since 1984, when it was introduced as a premium-based system. In 1965, the province began to provide public medical insurance<sup>6</sup> for those not covered by private plans, and three years later universal public medical insurance was implemented.

Today, our health care system in British Columbia treats every citizen regardless of race, gender, age, or condition. Health Care is publicly funded, meaning the government pays for many of the costs of providing health care services for all residents. The demand for health care and other support services is large and growing.

In fact, health care & social assistance was the province's second largest employer in 2008, with 245,600 people working in this industry in 2008. Thirty-seven percent are employed by hospitals. Doctors' and surgeons' offices, medical labs, and offices of other health practitioners such as chiropractors, optometrists, and physiotherapists provide jobs for 27% of the workforce. Nursing homes and other residential care facilities employ 15% of the people working in this industry.

Furthermore, Thompson-Okanagan, Vancouver Island/Coast and, to a lesser extent, Cariboo, account for a bigger share of total employment in this industry than their share of the provincial workforce. However, Mainland/Southwest's share is lower than its share of the total workforce in BC. This distribution of employment may be partly due to the age structure of the population. Health care needs tend to increase with age, so it is very likely that the demand for these services is somewhat greater in areas where there are more seniors, such as Thompson-Okanagan and Vancouver Island.

The need for health care & social assistance doesn't vary a lot with the state of the economy. People become sick or use social services such as day care whether the economy is growing or contracting. As such, the unemployment rate in health care & social assistance is extremely low, averaging 2.6% between 1990 and 2008. By comparison, the average for all industries was three times higher, at 7.8%.

**Please Note:** Though the Health Care and Social Services fields are interrelated, for the purposes of this publication we will be concentrating on the Health Care field only from this point on. ## Registered Nurses (RNs)<sup>2</sup>

### Job Description

Registered Nurses (RNs) provide direct overall organization of patient care while working with other care providers in various work settings. Nurses are employed in hospitals, nursing homes, extended-care facilities, community health agencies, health centres, clinics, rehabilitation centres, mental health centres, doctor's offices, schools, government, companies and private homes. Though there are very few in British Columbia, some nurses may be self-employed.

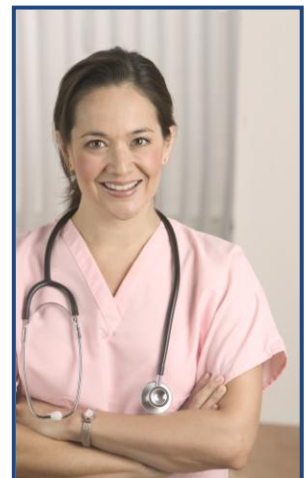
### Job Titles & Main Duties

#### Hospital Nurses

Most Hospital Nurses are staff nurses, who provide bedside nursing or direct care to patients. They consult with physicians and other members in the health care team to develop an effective care plan. They may be assigned to one area of the hospital such as surgical, critical care, maternity, pediatric, geriatric, psychiatric, emergency room, intensive care, or they may rotate among departments.

#### Nurses in Long-Term Care / Extended Care Settings

Nurses in these settings administer care for residents with conditions ranging from fractures to Alzheimer's disease. They assess residents' physical, psychological and social conditions and develop care plans. Nurses supervise the care of residents by Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs), Nursing Aids, and Resident Care Aids (RCAs) who perform various procedures, such as starting intravenous fluids. Nurses also work in specialty care departments, such as long term rehabilitation for stroke and heart-injury patients, or life skills programming for patients in psychiatric hospitals.



#### Community Health Nurses (Public Health Nurses)

These nurses work in government, private agencies, clinics, schools, retirement communities, homes and other community settings. They may provide direct care or make referrals to other health care providers. They provide health education, promotion and prevention for individuals, families and community groups. Additionally, Public Health Nurses provide immunizations, blood pressure testing and other health screening. Some Community Health Nurses work in home care, providing nursing care and coordinating delivery of other health care and support services.

#### Private Duty Nurses

Private Duty Nurses work directly for families on a contract basis or for a nursing or temporary agency that assigns nurses to patients needing constant care and attention.

## Office Nurses

These are Nurses that assist physicians in private practices, clinics and emergency medical centres. Some duties include preparing patients for and supporting them in exams, administering injections and medications, as well as dressing wounds and incisions. They also perform routine laboratory and office work.

## Occupational Health Nurses

These are Nurses who provide nursing care at worksites to employees, customers and others with minor injuries and illnesses. They provide emergency assistance, prepare accident reports and arrange for further care if necessary. In addition, they can provide health counseling, assist with health exams, vaccinations and work on accident prevention programs.

## Tele-Nurse

The BC Nurseline provides 24-hour, confidential health information and advice anywhere in the province. BC Nurseline is located in Burnaby and Langley and offers challenging career opportunities for qualified Nurses in full-time, part-time and casual positions. Requirements include a Nursing Diploma and current practicing registration with the CRNBC. ## Education & Training

---

Registered Nurses require the completion of an approved college or university Registered Nursing program. To practice as a Registered Nurse, students must have completed an approved College of Registered Nurses of BC (CRNBC) program and pass the CRNBC exams.

### Basic Requirements:

- Grade 12 Diploma with appropriate English, Math and Science courses
- Successful medical exam and immunizations
- Standard First Aid Certificate with CPR Level C Certification
- Successful Criminal Record Check
- Paid or volunteer work experience may also be required
- Must meet minimum English fluency standards

**Please note:** Increasingly, nursing education programs are finding it difficult to meet entry-level competencies for Registered Nurses within a diploma program. Training is moving in the direction of baccalaureate degree programs which normally involves approximately eight months of extra courses and clinical experiences beyond the diploma. Any phase-out of diploma programs or other changes to curriculum are handled by each institution. Please consult with the program faculty at the intended institution for more information regarding their requirements. (For complete program information on all institutions refer to the Opening Doors website ([www.educationplanner.bc.ca](http://www.educationplanner.bc.ca)) and perform a program search using the subject heading "Registered Nursing (RN) Related.")

It is also important to note that in the past, the majority of nursing programs have had many more applicants than available seats. Many employers, unions and nursing associations have lobbied the government to expand the number of positions for nursing training in BC as one approach to address the nursing shortage.

## Working Conditions

---

Most Nurses are required to work 8 to 12 hour shifts, usually on rotation and may work weekends and evenings. On average, nurses work 36 hours a week. They must have the physical and emotional stability to cope with the stress of caring for and working with those who are ill. Nurses are also exposed to the hazards of infectious diseases, radiation and chemicals.

## Wages

---

Earnings for nurses vary, depending on the skill level, number of years experience, bargaining power and various other factors. According to the BC Nurse's Union (which has adopted a nine-step pay scale) new graduates can earn up to \$29.00 per hour, while experienced nurses can earn \$39.00 per hour or more<sup>3</sup>. Non-unionized nurses generally earn less. Salaries for nurses are noticeably higher in BC than they are in other provinces such as Quebec and Newfoundland/Labrador<sup>4</sup>. Salaries for the top-paid nurses in BC reach upwards of \$90,000, while nurses at the lowest end of the pay scale earn approximately \$55,000<sup>5</sup>.

## Job Outlook

---

Population growth, an aging population and technological advancements have increased the demand for health services. The province is currently facing worker shortages in some health occupations and has waiting lists for many health services. It is anticipated that over half of all expected job openings will be due to the need to replace experienced workers who retire. Other factors that increase the chances of finding work in this sector include nurses leaving the occupation due to stress, changes in occupations, or the desire to raise a family. In the past, many newly graduated Nurses worked on a casual or on-call basis before securing regular status. This is beginning to change. Employers have started to create more full-time positions in an attempt to recruit and retain Nurses.

## Registered Nursing Assistants

All of these positions perform basic patient care within hospitals, nursing homes or other health care service facilities.

### Example Job Titles:

- Certified Nursing Assistant
- Operating Room Technician
- Licensed Practical Nurse
- Licensed Nursing Assistant
- Registered Nursing Assistant

## Job Titles & Main Duties

### Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs)

These Nurses are employed in hospitals, nursing homes, rehabilitation centres, doctor's offices, clinics, occupational health units, community nursing services and private homes. They assist Registered Nurses and Psychiatric Nurses in assessing, planning, implementing and evaluating nursing care. They work under the direction of Physicians and Nurses. In addition, they also make nursing decisions, provide required care for patients and are responsible for their own nursing actions. In British Columbia, LPNs must be licenced to work in the province by the CLPNBC (College of Licensed Practical Nurses of BC). Most Licensed Practical Nurses provide bedside care, taking vital signs such as blood pressure, pulse and respirations. They also distribute medication to patients and conduct various other treatments. In a nursing home setting, LPNs evaluate residents' needs, develop care plans, supervise Nursing Aides and perform clerical duties.

### Operating Room Technicians

Operating Room Technicians prepare patients for surgery, assist during surgery setting up equipment and passing instruments. They also clean and sterilize the operating room and instruments after the surgery is complete. LPNs may become operating room technicians with additional training.

## Working Conditions

Typically, Licensed Practical Nurses work in clean, bright and well-ventilated health care facilities. They often stand and walk for long periods of time as they move from patient to patient, performing various duties. Lifting or moving patients or equipment can result in back injuries. Most LPNs work in hospitals and nursing care facilities working 40 hours per week. Some LPNs work nights, weekends and holidays. Part-time and on-call work is common.

## Job Outlook

---

As with other Nursing positions, Licensed Practical Nurses should see steady growth as BC's growing and aging population increases the need for health care services. In recent years, increased salaries for Registered Nurses have made hiring LPNs more cost-effective, increasing the demand for their services. LPNs also have a wider scope of responsibilities than they used to which has increased their versatility.

## Wage

---

As of April 1, 2009 LPNs working for the Interior Health Authority earn approximately \$25.00 per hour<sup>6</sup>. However, as with other occupations, wages vary depending on experience and on whether workers are union or non-union employees. According to one site, LPNs with certification earned \$4,000 to \$7,000 per month.

## Education & Training

---

Licensed Practical Nurses are required to complete a vocational, college or other approved program. Registration with a regulatory body is required for all provinces. Completion of the Canadian Practical Nurse Registration exam as also needed.

Operating Room Technicians required either additional academic training in operating room techniques or on-the-job training.

## Dental Assistants<sup>7</sup>

Dental Assistants' duties include assisting Dentists during the examination and treatment of patients. They also perform clerical duties and educating the public on dental health. Most Dental Assistants work with Dentists in private practice. Others may be employed in public health or in education.

Those interested in becoming a Dental Assistant should have an aptitude for science, enjoy working with others and able to deal with people who may be under stress. Personal neatness, cleanliness and good health are also important. Dental Assistants must have manual agility, good interpersonal communication skills, basic analytical skills and knowledge of new technology in the field.

### Job Titles & Duties

#### Dental Assistants

They prepare treatment rooms and patients for treatment and assist Dentists during the procedures. Duties include mixing and preparing dental materials, performing infection control tasks and applying rubber dams. They also instruct patients on oral care.

Other duties under a Dentists' direct supervision can be included if they have successfully completed a recognized Dental Assistant program. They may also expose, process, and mount dental radiographs, polish teeth and apply topical fluoride and topical anesthetic. They may also take impressions of the teeth, apply fissure sealants and perform some orthodontic procedures.

Dental Assistants may also have clerical responsibilities including maintaining patient records, scheduling patients' appointments, collecting patient and insurance accounts, and ordering dental office supplies.

#### Certified Dental Assistants (CDAs)

These assistants are employed in general dental offices and specialty practices such as children's specialists, orthodontics or oral surgery. CDA's practice in hospitals, dental clinics, the BC Cancer Agency, community health clinics and residential care facilities for seniors and the disabled. They must qualify through education and examination in order to obtain a licence to practice. There are over 5700 CDAs registered in BC.

The difference between Dental Assistants and Certified Dental Assistants is that formal education is not required to do work as a Dental Assistant. The Dentist who employs you may train the Dental Assistant. Dental Assistants are not regulated or licenced while Certified Dental Assistants complete formal education and skills are examined using a standard testing. Since there are more skills delegated to the Certified Dental Assistant, there are more employment opportunities available.

## Dental Hygienists

These assistants provide dental hygiene treatments and educate the public about the prevention of diseases and disorders of the teeth and mouth, as well as dentistry-related disorders of the head and neck. They are employed in Dentists' offices, hospitals, clinics, educational institutions, government agencies and private industry. They may examine patients, collect their health history and consult with Dentists after coming up with an initial dental evaluation. They can perform any of the duties performed by a Certified Dental Assistant but carry a much broader scope of responsibilities.

## Working Conditions

---

Dental Assistants work in clean and well-lit Dentists' offices, hospitals, public health centres and education institutions. Dental Assistants usually work a 40-hour week, though some may work part-time and job share with other staff members. Among dental hygienists part-time work is especially common. Hours may include weekends and evenings as more Dentists have their businesses open to meet patients' needs outside regular office hours.

## Wage

---

According to the Job Futures website, the average hourly wage for Dental Assistants in BC is approximately \$16.50. There are differences in salaries earned by certified and uncertified Dental Assistants. Entry level Certified Dental Assistants earn between \$11 and \$15 per hour and extends to between \$14 and \$21 for experienced workers. Level entry uncertified Dental Assistants earn about \$8 per hour and about \$17 per hour for the experienced worker. Average annual earnings for dental hygienists are somewhat higher than the provincial all-occupation average, at approximately \$42,000 per year.

## Job Outlook

---

The unemployment rate for Dental Assistants is lower than the provincial average. This reflects the demand for dental services and as a result, the employment demand for Dental Assistants is higher. This work is not really affected by economic or seasonal fluctuations. Work prospect in this field are good because of the growing and aging population, which requires more health services. The number of retiring workers will also contribute to job openings. An increasing awareness of preventative dental care in today's aging population means more individuals recognize the connection between good oral health and keeping their natural teeth healthy longer. Some Dentists hire Dental Hygienists to perform preventative dental care while they devote more time to more restorative procedures.

## Education & Training

---

In order to work in this field, post secondary education in dental assisting is requested after secondary school graduation, such as the completion of a three-month to one-year college or other program in dental assistance. On-the-job-training is also possible. An individual with Level 1 training may work as a Chairside Dental Assistant with certification. However, to work as a Certified Dental Assistant you must complete CDA Level 2 training and obtain a license from the College of Dental Surgeons of BC.

Dental Hygienists are required to complete a 2 year college program in Dental Hygiene. Registration and licensing by the College of Dental Hygienists of BC is required prior to employment. Applicants must pass the National Dental Hygiene Certification Board Examination after all educational requirements have been met.



## Nurses Aides, Orderlies and Other Patient Service Associates<sup>8</sup>

### Example Titles:

- Health Care Aide
- Long Term Care Aide
- Nursing Attendant
- Patient Care Aide
- Ward Aide
- Hospital Porter
- Nurses Aide
- Orderly
- Personal Care Attendant

### Nurses Aides and Orderlies

The duties for these positions include assisting in the basic care of patients under the direction of Nurses, hospital staff and Physicians. They are employed in hospitals, nursing homes and other health care institutions. Orderlies in BC who belong to unions have the same training requirements and duties as Licensed Practical Nurses (*see previous sections for specific training required*).

They perform many of the same tasks as Licensed Practical Nurses including taking vital signs, answering call signals, collecting specimen samples as well as feeding and personal hygiene. In acute care as well as long term care settings, Orderlies perform nursing procedures such as catheterization and sterile dressings, under the direction of a Nurse. Nurses Aides and Orderlies will also transport patients in wheelchairs or stretchers for treatment or surgery, carry messages, reports, requisitions and specimens from one department to another and maintain an inventory of supplies.



### Working Conditions

Nurses Aides and Orderlies work in hospital wards or residential long-term care facilities. They usually work eight to 12 hour days, 36 to 40 hours per week and may also be required to work part-time, on-call, holidays and weekends. The job involves constant standing or walking with potential hazards such as back injuries and exposure to infectious diseases or toxic chemicals. There is also emotional stress of working closely with patients who are ill/disabled and their family members. Nurses Aides need to be physically fit, patient, kind, understanding, emotionally stable and dependable.

## Wages

---

The average hourly wage for Nurses Aides and Orderlies in BC is approximately \$15.00, well below the national average for all occupations. Just under half of those currently employed are working full-time and full-year. Earnings generally increase with higher skills, number of years worked, union membership and other factors. In unionized environments, entry level Nurses Aides may earn about \$30,000 per year, while experienced Nurses Aides can earn upwards of \$34,000 per year (much more than if employed in a non-unionized environments). Very few are self-employed.

## Job Outlook

---

### **Hospital Settings:**

In recent years, there has been a growing trend towards privatization of some health care services. If this were to happen, it may decrease the demand for Nurses Aides. Many hospitals have shifted towards hiring Licensed Practical Nurses and Registered Nurses instead of Nurses Aides.

### **Residential, Long-term, Extended Care and Community Living facility Settings<sup>9</sup>:**

Nurses Aides are employed mainly in residential care facilities, such as long-term care facilities, extended care facilities, intermediate care facilities and community living settings for people with mental, emotional or physical disabilities. Most future employment opportunities are expected to be in these areas. Many of these positions are in non-unionized environments. This is a very large occupational group which in turn offers excellent opportunities because of vacancies created as employees move in and out of positions.

Overall, the work prospects for this field are good, again because of the aging population requiring more in the way of health care services and the number of retirees in this industry as well.

## Education & Training

---

In BC, Nurses Aides are generally required to have completed a Resident Care Attendant program. Graduates are qualified to work with residents in continuing care settings, including extended and intermediate care facilities. Currently, Nurses Aides do not require registration to practice in BC. It is possible for Nurses Aides to become LPNs with further education. Those who enhance their skills with complementary training such as child care, mental health or rehabilitation assistant training, generally earn better wages and have greater success finding work.

Orderlies are required to have the same training as Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN) or have been trained as Orderlies in some other province or country. Some health care facilities also require completion of specialized courses such as CPR, First Aid certification and food handling/sterilization processes.

## Visiting Homemakers, Cleaners & Related Occupations<sup>10</sup>

Those in this category are employed by home support services, private households, home care agencies, or self-employed.

### Example Titles:

- Care Aide
- Housekeeping Aide
- Home Support Worker
- Housekeeper
- Hospital Cleaner
- Resident Care Aide
- Home-Health Aide
- Visiting Homemaker
- Personal Aide
- Room Attendant

### Visiting Homemakers

Homemakers provide ongoing or short-term home support services for individuals and families during periods of incapacitation, recuperation or family disruption. They are employed by government and non-profit agencies and home-care agencies or they are self-employed. They care for individuals and families providing bedside and personal care such as bathing, mobility and personal hygiene all under the direction of a home-care agency supervisor or Nurse.

### Companions

Companions provide elderly clients with companionship and personal care in residential or institutional settings. They are employed by home-care agencies, or they may be self-employed. They aid clients with mobility, bathing and other personal hygiene tasks.

### Light Duty Cleaners

Workers in the occupation clean the lobbies, hallways and rooms of hotels, motels, resorts, hospitals, schools, office and other buildings and private residences. They clean floors, bathrooms, change bed linen and empty trash containers.

### Working Conditions

Daily routines for these workers may vary. Generally, they work with a number of clients (often four or five per day) with each job lasting a few hours, days or weeks. Some homes are neat and pleasant, while others are untidy or unpleasant. Some clients are angry, abusive, depressed or difficult. Others are nice and cooperative. In BC, most Homemakers work for private or civic organizations. The government's role is confined to setting eligibility criteria. Generally, Homemakers work on their own with periodic visits by their supervisor working part-time and weekend hours. They may spend a large amount of time travelling from one client to another.

## Wages

---

The estimated average earning is about \$22,800 per year. The average hourly wage rate in this field is approximately \$11-\$12 per hour.

## Education & Training

---

### Basic requirements include:

- Grade 10
- Basic Rescuer First Aid Certification
- Driver's License

### Recommended:

- Course in supporting people with dementia
- Higher level first aid certificates beyond basic rescuer



### Other:

- Courses in home support and resident care (section included in this binder) offered by BC colleges in part-time and evening programs are very helpful in securing employment with more responsibility and better pay.

## Job Outlook

---

Work prospects in these fields are fair. The retirement rate for workers in this industry is above average and, generally, employment has been growing at an average rate. Unemployment is slightly below the national average for all occupations. According to the Canadian Occupational Projection System (COPS), there will be 3,560 positions becoming available from 2001 to 2011 due to retirements, worker turnover and new jobs being created. Workers in this sector have been able to help seniors or disabled individuals stay out of expensive residential care and stay in their homes for support services. Likely, the demand for their services will increase with the increased aging population. As well, due to government cut-backs in the past few years, many people who were previously eligible for home support services have had their services cut off or reduced. There is no sign that this policy is likely to change in the future so again, this will increase the amount of work available in this sector. Career advancement is somewhat limited but with experience and training, visiting Homemakers may move into such occupations as Health Care Aide or Long Term Care Aide in nursing homes and long term care facilities.

## Clerical & General Office Occupations<sup>11</sup>

This very large occupational group includes general office clerks, typists, receptionist and file clerks employed in offices throughout the public and private sector. The health care sector employs many medical clerks who work in hospitals, clinics and other health care facilities.

### Job Titles & Descriptions

---

Though the range of duties varies in office settings, the main responsibilities for most workers in this sector involve typing correspondence, reports and other documents. They also maintain filing, inventory, mailing and database systems, provide general information to clients and the public, and maintain files and records. They may also perform routine bookkeeping tasks such as preparing invoices and bank deposits. Those working in this sector need to be able to use a variety of office machinery and equipment including photocopiers, fax machines and computers.

#### General Office Clerks / Typists / Word Processing Operators

General Office Clerks spend much of their time preparing documents. Typewriters are rarely used, and most text processing is done using computers and word processing or desktop publishing software.

#### Receptionists / Switchboard Operators

Receptionists greet clients and visitors, directing them to the appropriate personnel or area. Receptionists answer telephones and assist walk-in visitors or clients. Switchboard operators mainly use telephone systems relaying calls and transferring to appropriate staff members.

#### Records & File Clerks / Medical Office Clerks / Medical Record Clerks

These clerks spend much of their time sorting and filing material and retrieving it when needed. They set-up and maintain filing systems. Many Records Clerks work specifically as Medical Office Clerks or Medical Records Clerks. They maintain patient health records and related information, prepare medical, social and administrative statistics. They apply their knowledge of medical terminology to do the work.

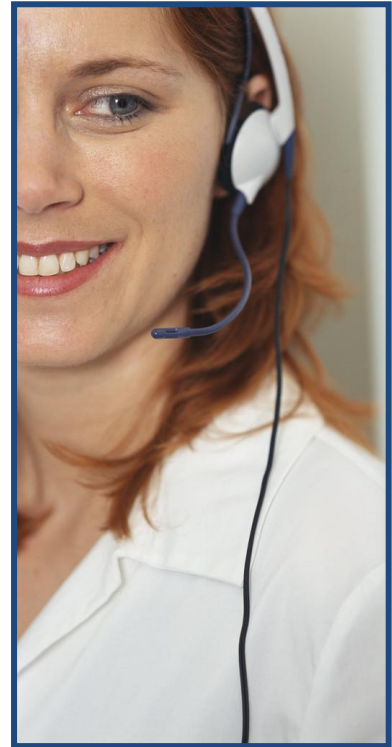

### **Medical or Ward Secretaries**

These secretaries schedule and confirm appointments, and receive and communicate messages to patients and doctors. They also type medical records, reports, articles and case histories. Secretaries also type correspondence from machine dictation, shorthand and handwritten notes using typewriters, word processors and computers. They interview patients to complete forms, documents and case histories.

### **Health Services Representatives (Langley, BC)**

Part of the Health Services Navigation Team for BC Healthlines Services, these Health Services Representatives relay health information and referrals to the public and health professionals throughout the province. Though the team is located in Langley, BC the opportunity and benefits are excellent with very minimal eligibility requirements. The duties include responding to telephone calls from the public, providing information and referrals and identifying available health services options in accordance with established criteria. The salary range is \$35-\$40,000 per year.



Eligibility requirements include:

- Typing speed of at least 40 wpm
- Excellent understanding and comprehension of the English language
- Exceptional written and oral communication skills
- Multi-tasking abilities and able to work in a fast-paced environment
- Able to think independently while working as part of a dynamic team

### **Patient Transfer Coordinator (Burnaby, BC)**

BC Bedline ([www.bcbedline.ca](http://www.bcbedline.ca)) collaborates with Physicians and other health care professionals to facilitate the safe and timely transfer of acute and critically ill patients. The duties include telephone calls from Physicians and other health care providers, logging the cases by entering patient information into a computerized database, and identifying available referral options in accordance with established criteria.

Eligibility requirements include

- Ability to type 40 wpm
- Knowledge of medical terminology
- Ability to communicate effectively both orally and in writing
- Ability to deal with others effectively
- Physical ability to carry out the duties of the position
- Ability to organize work
- Ability to operate related equipment
- Able to think independently while working as part of a dynamic team

## **Working Conditions**

---

Many positions are part and full time working 35 to 40 hours per week in regular office hours. There may be evening or weekend work and shift work required. Many clerical positions have been combined with others. For example, the need for general office clerks is not needed as much for this work can be done by highly skilled secretarial staff and typist combining the work done by several people into one position performing all tasks. Part-time employment is relatively common in this occupational group. Working from home as a Medical Transcriptionist is also another option. Though there are obvious pre-employment requirements for these positions, the employers that hire for this are actually quite numerous. For an extensive list of employers see website section of this handout.

## **Wages**

---

The average earnings for these workers are \$21,900 per year, with an average hourly earning of \$13.50. For those who were employed full-time for a full year, the average earning per year was \$31,600. Receptionist and switchboard operators earned the lowest average income at \$28,000. Records management and filing clerks averaged \$33,600. General office clerks averaged \$33,100 per year. The hourly wages in some cases starts at minimum wage, though average wages for union positions are higher. Experienced workers often progress to higher-paying jobs in related occupations, such as secretaries and office managers.

## **Education & Training**

---

The education and training requirements to obtain work in clerical occupations within the health care industry are quite similar. Many postings on the BC Interior Health website [www.roomtogrow.ca](http://www.roomtogrow.ca) require a Grade 12 Diploma and recent related experience or an equivalent of education, training and experience (totaling two or more years). The skills and abilities include typing 50 wpm and knowledge of medical terminology.

## Job Outlook

---

Between 2001 and 2011 it is expected that 7,850 positions will become available due to workers retiring. A high rate of worker turnover in these occupations as well will create additional openings. However, generally work prospects in this field are limited because of the relatively low average hourly wage (almost \$5.00 below the average hourly wage for all occupations). As well, the employment growth rate will likely be below average because new technologies and office automation will allow companies to do more with fewer workers. Although the retirement rate will likely be average, the number of retiring workers will contribute to job openings in this field<sup>12</sup>.

## Other Assisting Occupations in Health Support Services<sup>13</sup>

Workers in this sector perform a variety of support functions to assist health care professionals and staff. They are employed in hospitals, medical clinics and offices of health care professionals such as Chiropractors, Occupational Therapists and Physiotherapists.

## Job Titles & Descriptions

---

### Blood Donor Clinic Assistants

Workers in this occupation set-up equipment, maintain supplies and record information on donors. They also monitor donors throughout the blood donation procedure under the supervision of a registered nurse. They also label and process donated blood.

### Central Supply Aides

Central Supply Aides collect and sort supplies and instruments from hospital departments. They operate machines such as instrument washers, sonic sinks, cart washers and steam autoclaves to clean, reprocess and sterilize supplies for re-use. They assemble packs of sterile supplies and instruments to deliver to hospital departments.

### Chiropractic Aides

Chiropractic Aides assist patients who are elderly or incapacitated to undress, position patients on a table or chair for treatment by a Chiropractor or for machine treatments. As directed by a Chiropractor, Aides attach treatment machines to patients. They may also perform clerical duties.

## **Occupational Therapy Assistants**

Assistants in this profession prepare and maintain work materials and supplies and may assist patients in crafts or other activities as directed by an Occupational Therapist.

## **Physiotherapy Assistants**

They accompany patients to treatment rooms and also assist them with equipment and maintenance programs. They also clean physiotherapy equipment, change linens and manage appointment schedules.

## **Working Conditions**

---

Elemental Medical and Hospital Assistants work in constant contact with other people and may have to handle several responsibilities at once. Most work full-time an average of 37.5 hours per week with some evening and weekend work as well. The majority of workers in this group are found in hospitals. Other areas include working with physicians, health practitioners and medical labs.

## **Wages**

---

With an average hourly wage of \$14.50, earnings in these positions are below the average for occupations in the health sector, and close to the average for all intermediate occupations. However, the unemployment rate in this field is also well below the national unemployment rate.

## **Education & Training**

---

Some secondary school education (preferred Grade 12 Diploma) and on-the-job training is required for these positions. Health care courses or short-term programs related to the work of Medical Aides are available and may be required by employers. Other assets include knowledge about the BC Health Care System and/or experience working with individuals with disabilities.

## **Job Outlook**

---

The number of employed workers has increased considerably in recent years due to an increase in retiring workers and worker turnover. Individuals in this sector are especially vulnerable to advances in technology for they work so closely with medical equipment. Many physicians prefer to hire Elemental Medical and Hospital Assistants who have formal training or experience, particularly those who have certification. It is possible for these workers to be promoted to occupations such as aides and assistants in support health services. Overall, work prospects for employees in this sector are good, with a low unemployment rate and an average retirement rate. Generally the number of job seekers will likely match the number of job openings.



## Midwives & Practitioners of Natural Healing<sup>14</sup>

This sector includes Midwives, Acupuncturists, Chinese Medicine Practitioners, Herbalists, Homeopaths, Reflexologists, Rolfers, Shamans and Shiatsu Therapists. Midwives are employed by the BC Women's Hospital and they also practice in private homes and within the community. Most practitioners of natural healing are in private practice but they may also be employed by health clinics and health food stores. Many of these practitioners are self-employed and look after the finance and administration of the business.

### Job Titles & Descriptions

---

#### Midwives

Midwives perform exams to establish and monitor normal pregnancies and advise pregnant women as soon as any pregnancy risk is detected. They counsel and educate women concerning diet, exercise and other prenatal health practices. During labour, they monitor the condition of the mother and baby and guide the birthing process. If an emergency arises, they take appropriate measures and arrange for contact with physicians. They also examine and care for newborn babies and educate mothers on health care. In the community, midwives may conduct classes on pregnancy and childbirth, as well as family planning and other related topics.

#### Acupuncturist & Chinese Medicine Practitioners

These practitioners diagnose diseases, physiological disorders and injuries of their patients. Acupuncturists use needles sometimes in combination with laser and electric stimulation. Chinese Medicine Practitioners may use acupuncture, herbs and other medicine to treat patients. They may also provide dietary advice.

#### Homeopaths

Homeopaths diagnose illness and treat patients. They administer small amounts of herbal or chemical extract orally or by injection. They also suggest lifestyle changes.

#### Herbalist

Herbalists provide advice on the use of herbs to treat conditions such as arthritis, rheumatism, asthma, skin problems and stomach ailments. They may also sell products that treat these conditions.

## Reflexologist & Shiatsu Therapists

These therapists apply finger pressure to specific spots on the clients' hands or feet to assist clients to relax and to relieve ailments.

## Rolfers

Rolfers systematically manipulate various parts of the body, such as the legs and shoulders, in order to realign the structure of the body and reduce chronic pain or stress.

## Working Conditions

---

Midwives either work at clients' homes or in hospitals. They may travel frequently between homes and hospitals and are on-call 24 hours a day. Those in non-hospital settings work in group practice which helps them accommodate emergency calls. Other practitioners of natural healing work in private clinics, health food stores or in their own facility.

## Wages

---

Earnings for practitioners vary greatly, depending on the numbers of clients they serve. The average annual earning as of 2000 was \$20,800. Those who worked full-time and full year earned \$30,500 on average. Other factors affecting earnings is whether their services are publicly or privately funded. Currently, midwifery services are fully funded by the Medical Services Plan. For up to six weeks of pre and post natal care, Midwives can bill the provincial government \$2,500 for each patient. Those in private practice working throughout the year full-time can bill up to \$120,000 per year (averaging \$65,000 to \$70,000 annually).

## Education & Training

---

### Midwifery in BC<sup>15</sup>

To become a Midwife you must complete a College of Midwives of BC (CMBC) approved program. It is a four-year direct-entry education program leading to a university degree. All programs offer clinical experience working in a model of practice that is the same or very similar to the model in BC. All graduates will meet CMBC requirements for general registration. To legally practice Midwifery in BC you must be registered with the CMBC.

## Job Outlook

---

Industry sources indicate that 88 Midwives were registered in BC in 2004. In the Lower Mainland, there is currently more demand for services than can be supplied. The demand for midwifery services in rural areas is equally strong.

There are approximately 700 individuals practicing acupuncture, some of whom also prescribe remedies and other treatments for patients. Currently Midwives and Acupuncturists are the only practitioners regulated in the province. It is expected that the demand for these services will increase. It is estimated that the number of Midwives will double in the next decade due to a more culturally-diverse provincial population and the growing interest in alternative medicine and methods for physical and mental health. Between 2010 and 2015 it is estimated that there will be as many as 300 new jobs in this sector and 180 projected openings due to retirement.



## Ambulance Attendants & Paramedical Occupations<sup>16</sup>

**Emergency Medical Assistants (EMAs) or Emergency Medical Responders (EMRs)** provide first aid and administer pre-hospital medical services to minimize disability or loss of life in emergency situations. They are skilled in areas of first aid, general ambulance practices and procedures, basic nursing, patient assessment, specialized diagnostics and treatments. EMAs are licensed members of the health care team and work for BC Ambulance Service which is the sole provider of public ambulance services for the province and is independent of police, fire and hospital agencies. There are five different levels of emergency medical assistants depending on the amount of training. These are EMA First Responder (firefighters or police officers where providing emergency medical assistance is not their primary role), EMA First Aid, EMA 1, EMA 2 and EMA 3.

## **Job Titles, Descriptions & Qualifications**

---

There are four different levels within the Emergency Medical Assistant (EMA) occupation nationally, relating to the level of training a worker has acquired: Emergency medical responder, Primary care paramedic, Advanced care paramedic and Critical care paramedic. Each position will have specific educational requirements (see below), but all positions have general prerequisites to qualify for employment, including

- You are of good character
- You are at least 19 years of age
- You have a Grade 12 Diploma or equivalent
- You are legally entitled to work in Canada
- You are available to work a variety of shifts as required
- You are medically fit and have successfully completed a Criminal Record Search

### **Advanced Care Paramedic (ACP) – Highest level Paramedic**

These paramedics are highly trained and skilled pre-hospital emergency care providers. They complete intricate patient assessments and make critical emergency care decisions in a fast-paced environment. Advanced Care Paramedics work on complex cases and can pursue work with special events teams like the Bike Squad, Heavy Urban Search and Rescue Team, or become a flight paramedic.

#### **❖ Licenses and Certificates**

- A valid Advanced Care Paramedic License issued by the Emergency Medical Licensing Board.
- A Class 4 Unrestricted License. While a lesser license may be accepted, in order to drive a BCAS ambulance, ACPs will be required to hold a license that the BC Motor Vehicle Act Regulations recognizes for the operation of an ambulance.

### **Emergency Medical Responder (EMR)**

They provide emergency patient care including assessing the nature and degree of the patient's injuries, illness, or other pre-existing medical conditions. Their duties range from administering basic first aid to advanced treatments such as starting intravenous fluids, using monitors, and other complex equipment. Individuals in these positions need to have the knowledge, skills and abilities required to assess and manage a variety of trauma and medical patients in a pre-hospital setting.

#### **❖ Licenses and Certificates for EMR**

- A valid Emergency Medical Responder License issued by the Emergency Medical Licensing Board.
- A Class 4 Unrestricted License. While a lesser license may be accepted, in order to drive a BCAS ambulance, EMRs will be required to hold a license that the BC Motor Vehicle Act Regulations recognizes for the operation of an ambulance.

## **Primary Care Paramedic (PCP)**

These paramedics perform an organized patient assessment, attend to life-threatening injuries and conditions, perform PCP treatments, procedures and protocols and record and report patient information. The PCP licence is the preferred entry-level qualification within the BC Ambulance Service. Those who are interested in working with the BC Ambulance Service usually begin employment in Primary Care Paramedic positions that are on-call and part-time. They can build up seniority, experience and training and can move to other part-time stations and bid into full-time regular positions. This also allows for flexibility in moving to other stations throughout British Columbia.

### **❖ Licenses and Certificates**

- A valid Primary Care Paramedic License issued by the Emergency Medical Licensing Board.
- A Class 4 Unrestricted License. While a lesser license may be accepted, in order to drive a BCAS ambulance, PCPs will be required to hold a license that the BC Motor Vehicle Act Regulations recognizes for the operation of an ambulance.

## **Emergency Medical Dispatcher (EMDs)**

These call-takers work in an Emergency Communications Centre, receiving in-bound calls and gathering critical information from a variety of callers including members of the public, police, fire, Coast Guard and Search & Rescue agencies. EMDs use approved protocols to assess the calls and then dispatch the appropriate resource. BC Ambulance Service has centres located in Vancouver, Victoria and Kamloops that operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

### **❖ Licenses and Certificates**

- A valid Cardiopulmonary resuscitation-certificate (CPR-C)
- A valid Occupational First Aid-3 (OFA-3) certificate
- Please note that preference will be given to applicants who have formal training in emergency communications.

### **❖ Other Desired Skills and Abilities**

- Approach problems and decisions methodically
- Demonstrate the use of sound judgment when making decisions
- Adapt quickly in a dynamic environment
- Prioritize multiple competing tasks
- Readily assume a leadership role
- Help foster a team atmosphere in the workplace
- Communicate and actively build relationships with other team members
- Actively seek win-win solutions
- Be comfortable with healthy conflict, and support/manage differences of opinions
- Keep emotions in perspective with the workplace

## Working Conditions

---

Most Primary Care Paramedics (PCPs) in BC are employed by the BC Ambulance Service (BCAS). As with other first aid occupations, these are not always full-time positions. Full-time paramedics work assigned shifts, while part-time paramedics work on-call, depending on need, scheduling, and availability.

EMRs (Emergency Medical Responders), however, are hired only on a part-time, on-call basis. Working as an EMR is an entry-level, community focused position that is ideal for people who live and work in a rural or remote area and have a desire to make a difference.

Careers in BC Ambulance Service (BCAS) Dispatch/Communications Centers offer challenging work in a fast-paced environment. BCAS has centers located in Vancouver, Victoria and Kamloops that operate 24 hours a day 7 days a week.

Those in the occupation work indoors and outdoors in various types of weather. The work is physically and emotionally demanding with much time being spent standing, kneeling, bending and lifting. Workers may be exposed to contagious or dangerous diseases. Many find this type of work to be challenging yet rewarding. Workers may be required to work *shifts, weekends and holidays*.

## Wages & Benefits

---

According to Work Futures, the hourly wages in this sector are approximately \$28.00/hr, slightly above the national average. As well, those who worked full-time, full-year earned an average of \$57,678, though wages vary greatly between PCPs and first aid attendants.

According to the BC Ambulance Service Emergency Medical Responders earn between \$15 and \$20.00 per hour. However, depending on experience and job location, EMRs can make up to \$30-\$40.00 per hour. A Primary Care Paramedic, depending on whether they are employed with the BCAS or industry, earns between \$20 and \$30.00 per hour. A full-time Dispatcher earns an average of \$44,000 annually while part-time earn an hourly wage of \$20.17. The starting hourly wage for Advanced Care Paramedics with the BC Ambulance Service is \$31.00 per hour with a maximum hourly rate of \$35.75 for this position.

The BC Ambulance Service offer benefits to their employees including:

- Full medical plans
- Comprehensive dental and extended health plans
- Group life, optional spousal insurance, accidental death and dismemberment
- Employee assistance plan and CIS debriefing support services
- Pension plans

## Job Outlook

---

The total number of job openings between 2006 and 2011 is estimated at 730 due to population growth and retired workers. There is high turnover in this occupation due to injuries and stress which will increase the need for more workers. Industry sources indicate there are many qualified First Aid Attendants in the province and securing full-time employment is difficult. Those that have other skills in addition to their first aid skills will find it easier to find employment. With additional training, first aid attendants can become EMAs or can pursue a career in occupational health and safety. EMAs that have level 3 training may be able to work as supervisors or pursue careers in nursing or other health care areas.

## Education & Training<sup>17</sup>

---

The **Emergency Medical Responder (EMR)** introductory course offers first-hand knowledge for anyone wanting to enter the health care field. This course must be completed in order to equip them with the skills necessary to gain employment as an EMR. This course also includes Canadian/American Heart and Stroke Basic Life Support (BLS) for health care providers Level C certification. EMR certification is one of the mandatory admission requirements for the Paramedic Academy's Primary Care Paramedic program at the Justice Institute of BC.

### Admission Requirements include:

- Minimum 16 years of age
- Submission of a medical certificate
- Proof of completion of grade 10 English or equivalent

The **Primary Care Paramedic (PCP)** program is designed to provide a solid foundation in preparation for employment opportunities as a paramedic in a wide variety of pre-hospital care environments. Upon successful completion of the program, graduates are eligible to apply for licensure in BC through the Emergency Medical Assistant Licensing Branch.

The **Advanced Primary Care (APC)** program builds on skills previously developed in the Primary Care Paramedic (PCP) program. Successful completion of the program includes an Advanced Diploma as well as the following certificates:

- Pediatric Education Pre-hospital Providers (PEPP) Advanced
- Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP)
- Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) Program
