Introduction¹

When you fill up your car with gasoline, or pay your natural gas heating bill, you are the final link in a long chain of businesses that make it possible for us to use these convenient and economical forms of energy. The entire chain is known as the petroleum industry, but is usually divided into three major components: upstream, midstream, and downstream.



➤ **Upstream** industry finds and produces crude oil and natural gas. The upstream is sometimes known as the exploration and production (E&P) sector.



➤ **Midstream** industry processes, stores, markets and transports commodities such as crude oil, natural gas, natural gas liquids (NGLs, mainly ethane, propane and butane) and sulphur.



➤ **Downstream** industry includes oil refineries, petrochemical plants, petroleum products distributors, retail outlets and natural gas distribution companies.

The information in this binder will focus more on the “upstream” industry of finding and producing crude oil.

Did You Know?²

- Canada is the 3rd largest natural gas producer and the 6th largest crude oil producer
- Presently, Canada’s entire petroleum industry directly and indirectly employs more than 500,000 people
- It is expected that approximately 105,000 workers will need to be hired by 2020 to support new industry activity and to replace retiring workers
- Workforce shortages are expected to return for some occupations in 2011 and across the petroleum industry as a whole in 2012
- Retiring workers will affect all sectors within the petroleum industry within the next 10 years
- Oil sands will provide the greatest number of new employment positions versus replacement positions
- E&P and the Petroleum Services (Petroleum services includes well services, oilfield construction and maintenance, production and transportation services) will remain the industry’s biggest employers.

Career Planning

There is a wide range of jobs in the oil and gas industry. The information in this binder will cover the most common careers and information directly related to them.

Employment Prospects³

Employment prospects in the Mining, quarrying and oil and gas extraction industry group are expected to be above average in the upcoming years.

New openings will be the result of job creation as well as replacement demand due to the retirement of current workers over the next few years. However, because this industry employs a relatively small number of workers, the number of expected job opportunities will not be numerous.

Demand for workers in this industry group will be partly due to growth in oil and gas extraction. Output is expected to increase in response to rising global demand.



Employment opportunities will be best for people with previous experience in the oil and gas extraction industry and with strong technical skills. In particular, there is strong demand for qualified professionals and extraction workers who have significant experience in oil field operations and can work with new technology. As employers develop and implement new technologies, such as 3-D and 4-D seismic exploration methods and horizontal and directional drilling techniques, workers capable of using sophisticated equipment will be needed. Workers with deep-sea exploration and drilling experience will also be in demand if off-shore oil and gas development proceeds in the North Coast region.

Improvements in productivity in the Mining sector due to increased use of technology will lead to demand for fewer but more highly skilled workers. New computer-operated mining machines that can self-diagnose mechanical problems require fewer workers to operate and maintain. Advances in less labour-intensive longwall and surface mining have also increased productivity, as have improvements in transportation and processing. Additional innovations, such as roof bolting, self-advancing roof supports and continuous mining machinery, have led to safer, more efficient operations.

Industry sources report current shortages of workers in this industry group, particularly of skilled workers with experience. Recruitment and retention challenges stem from high retirement rates, public misperceptions of danger in the industry, and competition for skilled workers from employers in Alberta. As a result of these factors, there will be good opportunities for job seekers in the province.

Work Environments⁴



- Depending on your position in the petroleum industry, the type of conditions that one will be expected to work within will vary. For more specific information on working conditions, refer to the “Careers in Oil and Gas: Rich with Potential” brochure that is laminated at the back of this binder. (Appendix 1)
- Overall, oil and gas work takes place outdoors, in remote locations, and workers are vulnerable to all kinds of weather conditions. Workers should be prepared to spend their days at a noisy and dusty or muddy work site. In addition, workers may also have to move from location to location in search of oil. Working conditions are sometimes difficult.
- Although workers spend most of their day performing physical duties, these are jobs that demand mental alertness as well. Mistakes can be very costly and dangerous. Workers must be able to come together as a team to ensure the safety of all crew members. All workers are required to follow strict safety codes and must wear gloves, eye protection, hard hats, and steel-toed boots.
- Rotating shift work is usual. A typical shift may vary from 8 to 12 hours depending on the worker's position and the location of the work. Workers often belong to unions, where seniority may be important in obtaining shifts. In the case of smaller operators, work may be on a contract-to-contract basis, and layoffs may occur in between.

Earnings⁵

Earnings vary according to the position, employer, location, experience of the applicant, hours worked, etc. However, most companies will follow the Canadian Association for Oilwell Drilling Contractors (CAODC's) recommended wages as a guideline for their employees (starting at \$23.00/hr for the first 8 hours and then time and a half).

➤ Assistant Driller	\$33.50/hr
➤ Derrickhand	\$32.25/hr
➤ Motorhand	\$27.50/hr
➤ Floorhand	\$25.25/hr
➤ Leasehand	\$23.00/hr

Types of Careers⁶

With over 300 different positions in Canada's oil and gas industry, interested applicants have many options to pursue. The industry allows for someone that has little education and training to start in entry-level type positions and enables trained trades/professionals to develop a career. The following is a sample of what types of positions would fall under what category of employment:

Entry-level Positions: *High School Diploma Preferred; Safety Training*

- Helpers, Labourers and Semi-Skilled Workers
- Marine & Nautical Services (*regulated by Transport Canada*)

Technical/Trades Positions: *Requiring Technical School or College Certification*

- Trades
- Technicians/ Technologists
- Operators

Professional Positions: *Requiring University and/or Professional Designation*

- Geologists & Geophysicists
- Engineers
- Specialty Business Services (Air transportation, Accounting, etc.)
- Management

Careers In-Demand⁷ (Short Term Outlook)

The Petroleum Human Resources Council of Canada recently determined the current level of demand for different kinds of industry workers across Canada. Companies have reported the following occupations to be in high demand or particularly difficult to recruit for (occupations are grouped by key job families):

- Geoscience Professionals, particularly Geologists and Geophysicists
- Engineers, including Chemical; Civil and Facilities; Cost Control; Electrical/Instrumentation/Process Control; Environmental; Geological; Marine-related; Metals and Metallurgical; Mechanical; Mining and Petroleum
- Technologists, specifically Computer Engineering; Chemical Engineering; Civil and Structural Engineering; Electrical Engineering; Engineering Design and Drafting; Geological Geophysical and Seismic as well as Petroleum Engineering
- Technicians particularly Electrical; Geological, Seismic and Mineral as well as Warehouse

Careers in Demand (Short Term Outlook) Continued

- Trades, specifically Millwrights; Heavy-duty Equipment Mechanics/Technicians; Industrial Electricians; Industrial Instrument Mechanics; Insulators; Rig Technicians; Steamfitters and Pipefitters as well as Welders
- Operators, including Heavy Equipment; Well Services and Drilling Rig Operators
- Field Workers, particularly Seismic; Drilling and Service Rig as well as Well Services Workers
- Business and Operations Support, specifically in Environmental; Health and Safety; Joint Venture; Land Negotiation and Management; Petroleum Customer Relations; Regulatory Affairs; Stakeholder Relations and Well and Facility Asset Management.

Careers In-Demand⁸ (Long Term Outlook)

Projections by the **Petroleum Human Resources Council of Canada** show workforce shortages beginning in some occupations as early as 2011 and across the whole industry in 2012. Retiring workers will affect all sectors within the petroleum industry over the next 10 years. Projections show that with all of these factors the demand for workers will exceed the supply.

Qualifications⁹

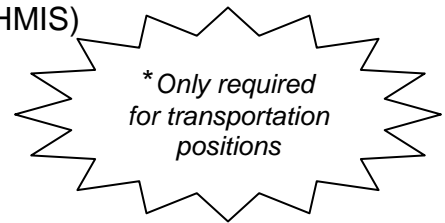
Different jobs require different skill sets, training, and levels of education. As do the individual companies who are hiring. However, there are some “typical” basic requirements that anyone wishing to work in the oil and gas industry should have.

Basic Requirements: *Criminal record check based on company policy*

- Completion of High School or GED
- Class 5 or Class 3 “clean” drivers’ licence – because no matter what career you choose, you have to get to the well site
- Must be drug and substance free
- Must have a level of physical fitness that allows you to complete your work duties

Mandatory Safety Tickets: *See the Training & Education section for more information.*

- H2S Alive
- Workplace Hazardous Material Information Systems (WHMIS)
- Occupational First Aid Level I
- Confined Spaces
- Defensive Driving*
- Transportation Endorsement*
- Transportation of Dangerous Goods*



Safety Gear: *Companies will have their own clothing requirements, but these are the basic requirements. They will cost you approximately \$300.*

- Hard hat & goggles
- Fire retardant coveralls (Insulated coveralls required in the winter)
- Steel-toed work boots and good quality work gloves

Basic Skills for Success:

- Reading and writing skills; communication skills
- Problem solving and decision making skills
- Planning and organizational skills
- Computer literacy and documentation skills (plans, directions, etc.)
- Math and science skills
- Mechanical aptitude

Common Industry Values:

- Motivated to succeed
- Positive attitude
- Teamwork
- Desire to learn and progress
- Good work ethic

Training and Education¹⁰

The level of education or training required depends on the position and company you want to work for, but generally one can start in level-entry jobs with just a high school education. Your safety is, of course, a top priority at any company and so some basic kind of safety certification is required.

Most workplaces provide their own on-site safety training for employees - training that is specifically tailored to the particular job, site and company, but there are also other organizations and formal programs to help you increase your safety knowledge and chances of employment.

Work Search Tips

Hiring Season

While employment is year round, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, the industry definitely experiences slow periods and peak periods (November – Spring Break-up). Spring break-up depends on the weather.

Generally, oil and gas companies hire management, supervisory, administration and ticketed journeyman trades people (often with a Red Seal).¹¹ All other positions are hired by the companies contracted by the oil and gas companies.

How to Apply

Many of the larger companies have job opportunities posted on their website and prefer that new employees apply for a position within their company by completing a downloadable application form from their website. This allows applicants to complete a “profile” outlining their work experience and types of positions that they would be interested in pursuing, plus attach an electronic copy of their resume. If a position is not currently available, some sites have the option of alerting you for future openings.

Each company has their own preferences as to how they want people to apply for positions and recognize that not everyone will have access to the online application process. So in other cases, companies are open to receiving a resume and cover letter by fax, mail, or by e-mail. Please note that generally plants do not have walk-in recruitment offices and therefore, do not accept resumes in-person. So, do your research and ensure that you are forwarding your resume and cover letter to the right person the right way – to optimize your chances of success!

A well written resume with a clear job objective is necessary for all job seekers and generally only those selected for an interview will be contacted.

Things You Should Know Before Heading North¹²

Some of the oil patch work in Fort St. John involves going to camp, but not all of it. If you get a job like this, your accommodations in camp cover your food and lodging. You still need a place to live because you will get undetermined days off, sometimes without notice. Also with camp work, most people have to arrange for their own transportation to the camp.

- **Money:** Have enough money to live on for at least a few days, while you find a place to live.
- **Clothing:** Bring warm clothing! The temperature ranges between -20 to -40 during the winter months. Drilling takes place in cold weather; the ideal range is between -30 to -35.
- **Research:** Contact potential employers before heading north. Some companies will refund some of your training costs upon hiring, so it's worth making some phone calls before you leave.
- **Accommodations:** There has been an increasing demand for affordable housing in these areas and the vacancy rate (availability of housing) is low. We urge you to begin your search for accommodations as early as possible. There is also a men's hostel in town which operates on a first come first served basis, where you can stay for a **maximum of 5 nights**. There is also a rooming house, Maples Court, which offers a low rate accommodation at **\$20/night** for males only.

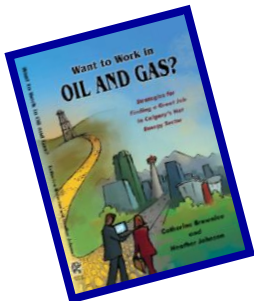
